SPRING GREETINGS, FRIENDS!

I hope this letter finds you happy and rejuvenated as we say goodbye to winter and move through the spring thaw. As we celebrate this new season, we are also celebrating an exciting new partnership that will help us reach

out to help even more homeless pets.

A few months ago, the ASPCA asked Animal Allies Humane Society to become a partner in their Field Investigations and Response Partner Program. As partners, we would be asked to help in two ways if an emergency situation arose: we could send staff or volunteers to the scene to aid the ASPCA in their response or we could elect to take in animals who needed shelter care. Animal Allies would be free to choose our response on a case-by-case basis, allowing us to evaluate our capacity to help depending on the needs of our own community's animals.

Our first chance to assist came in March when the ASPCA responded to a 700-animal neglect case in North Carolina, their largest companion animal rescue ever. Two of our staff, Kennel Manager Kat Pinchen and Veterinary Assistant Alex Alexsevich, volunteered and were chosen to fly to North Carolina and spend a week assisting the ASPCA to care for, treat, and prepare these animals for adoption. As an added bonus, the ASPCA covered all transportation and living costs while Kat and Alex were deployed so there were no added costs to our organization.

This was a fantastic opportunity for Kat and Alex to get hands-on experience working in the field alongside ASPCA experts, gaining knowledge and practical training that they then brought home to our organization. This new partnership will not only help animals in desperate need, but it will give our staff and volunteers the opportunity to learn and grow.

Animal Allies continues to focus on building a strong foundation for our future: one in which we are able to send our committed staff to assist with national concerns while still addressing the needs of our community's animals.

In the spirit of building a lasting foundation, I would like to share a final thought with you. On page four and five of this newsletter, you will find an article that *The Woman Today* magazine has generously allowed us to re-print. This piece resonated with me both as the leader of Animal Allies and as a mother. I appreciated how it encouraged families to talk about charitable giving and create a family mission. Identifying the causes that are close to one's heart nourishes the spirit of philanthropy. I hope you enjoy the article as much as I did and reflect on ways you can help build a secure future for homeless animals by including us in your planned giving.

CHARITABLE GIVING AND ESTATE PLANNING FROM THE HEART

Estate planning isn't all about wills and trusts, taxes and avoiding probate. At the heart of estate planning is your desire to care for the persons and causes that you love, right? In this article, I talk about an important aspect of estate planning — charitable giving — and offer ideas for making giving a family affair. These are things everyone can do, even without the assistance of a lawyer, accountant, or financial advisor!

In our homes, holiday celebrations present a wonderful opportunity to engage in meaningful conversations about our values, our philanthropy, and our legacy. Holidays like Thanksgiving not only inspire feelings of gratitude and generosity, but also often offer a chance for multiple generations to gather in one place. Some estate planning lawyers think it is taboo to start a conversation about charitable giving, but I encourage you to share your legacy plans with your children and grandchildren and to engage them in conversations about their own.

If you need suggestions about how to get started, one good idea is to develop a family giving mission statement — just a few sentences that describe the goals you are trying to achieve through your charitable giving, e.g., "protecting the environment" or "ending hunger in our community."

During the holiday, invite everyone to write down their own vision and share it with the rest of the family. Use the discussion that ensues to reach consensus around the shared principles that you believe should guide your giving. The resulting mission statement can then be consulted for future giving decisions. Whether you have \$10 or \$10 million, everyone can be a philanthropist!

I would also encourage you to write a "legacy letter" to your family members. The purpose of the legacy letter is to share memories and values and to let your family know what is most important in your charitable giving. Your thoughts, opinions, and philosophy will be treasured both now and after you are gone.

It does not matter whether your legacy letter is one paragraph or ten pages long, but to be the most persuasive, your letter should include a description of what drives you and what you stand for when it comes to philanthropy. State your values, your beliefs and the things that are most important to you.

Write about the gifts to charity that gave you the most satisfaction and explain what made them meaningful for you. Speak about the lessons you learned about giving that you would like to pass on to your children and grandchildren. Share cherished memories, events, and people that made an impact in your charitable giving.

These messages can be very powerful. Your legacy letter can be a window into your heart, who you are, and what you believe in — a personal, insightful letter that your family will value and always remember.





I would like to share with you a part of my legacy letter to my son, which I wrote when he was 16:

I attended high school in Wisconsin Rapids,
Wisconsin. At that time, most scholarships were
need based; very few were merit based. Although
I graduated in the top 2 percent of a class of
more than 600 students, I received only a \$300
scholarship from Rotary. My involvement in the
Duluth Superior Area Community Foundation
inspired me to "pay it forward" by donating money
to the Rotary Club in Wisconsin Rapids. Superior
High School has some really good scholarship
funds. If you are fortunate enough to receive a
scholarship when you graduate, it is my hope that
someday you will "pay it forward" too.

Stories like these, shared over time, create for our children and grandchildren the opportunity to have a personal and significant experience with philanthropy. This experience is invaluable to the next generation. A legacy letter isn't a legally binding document, but we can all do our part, big or small, to make this world a better one.

CAN YOU HELP?

We welcome volunteers in any area, but right now we especially need volunteers for our Kennel Buddy and Adoption Ambassador positions.

KENNEL BUDDY: Kennel Buddies work alongside Kennel Attendants at the shelter to keep cat and dog kennel areas clean. You may also have occasional feeding and walking duties as well.

ADOPTION AMBASSADOR: Our Adoption Ambassadors choose an adoptable animal to foster and then promote for adoption. You'll be given an "adopt me" vest for the animal, the animal's records, an adoption folder, and the adoption contract. Once you find a suitable adopter, they can fill out the adoption contract and take their new pet home! This program allows Animal Allies to help more animals by creating space in the shelter, helps spread the word about what we do, and helps our community become engaged in the importance of animal rescue.

VOLUNTEER HOURS

In the first three months of 2016, volunteers donated 6,095 hours – the equivalent of nearly 12 full-time employees! Kitties and Cattails and Their Little Dogs, Too (ages 7-8) | June 20-24

Explore the secret life of cats. Learn their behaviors and how to understand body language of tails, whiskers, and ears. Teach them tricks, games, and other fun activities. Occasionally we'll have fun with dogs, too! (If you're older than 8 and want to come because it sounds so fun, we'll make room for you after our 7-8 year olds sign up.)

Games Dogs and Cats Play (ages 8-12) | July 11-15

What things can we do for shelter dogs and cats and our own animals at home to keep them busy, happy, healthy, out of trouble, and challenge their minds? (We MUST exercise the mind and body. Dogs and cats are too smart when we forget to exercise their brains.) Have fun teaching old and young dogs all kinds of new tricks; make the dogs and cats really happy with games and activities just for them.

Art with the Animals (ages 10-14) | July 25-29

Come draw, photograph, paint, create cartoon messages, and mingle with the animals. Meet shelter animals and hear stories of their lives, and use drawing, painting, sculpture, and stories to share cats' and dogs' lives through YOUR artwork. Stories and art will help visitors to know more about our adoptable animals. Campers can use shelter animals' stories to inspire drawings, paintings, messages of responsibility, respect, safety, and kindness.

Shelter Dogs and Cats: Making Them Famous, Getting Them Adopted! (ages 8-12) | August 8-12 Some of our cats and dogs spend too long in the shelter and really need people to know about them. Campers will get to know our cats and dogs, find out their likes and dislikes, their talents and special-ness. They will write stories, draw their pictures, take photos, and create fun videos featuring adoption animals to help them be noticed and get adopted. Several lucky campers will appear on television with an adoptable animal and tell their story!

So You Want To Be An Animal-Something? (ages 10-14) | August 22-26

Learn about careers in animal care and welfare: groomers, animal control officers, veterinarians, veterinary technicians, massage therapists, trainers, pet sitters, canine officers, wildlife rehabilitators, show dog handlers, animal foster care families, boarding facility manager, farrier, zookeeper, aquarium diver, animal photographer, naturalist, (Whew!) We could spend a whole day with any one of these. When you register for camp, you'll suggest some careers you are interested in and we can include some of your "dream career" people on our guest list!

GET INVOLVED: BECOME AN ADOPTION AMBASSADOR

An Adoption Ambassador is able to have a much larger influence in the life of their foster animal(s) by leading a quest to find them a permanent, loving home.

How it works:

Step 1- Work with Animal Allies staff to choose an animal that you're interested in fostering. The animal should be a good fit for your home environment and, in turn, you should be a good fit for the animal's needs.

Step 2- You take on the responsibility of finding this animal a home. Animal Allies will send you home with an "adopt me" vest for the animal to wear, the animal's records, an adoption folder, and the adoption contract. We will explain how the adoption process works, what the animal will need to find in their new home (whether or not they can live with other animals, children, etc.), and will answer any other questions you may have.

Step 3- The animal comes home with you. Using various forms of social media, advertising, networking, etc. you can work towards finding a new family for your foster animal. Take notes on the animal's behaviors, likes, dislikes, favorite toys, food, and activities. Share this information with potential adopters. Once you find a suitable adopter, they can fill out the adoption contract and take their new pet home! Snap a picture of the happy scene if you are able. Then, all you have to do is return the paperwork to Animal Allies. You're left feeling like you've made an incredible difference and the animal is left with a fresh start with a new home and family!

Step 4- Send us feedback about how things went. What worked? What didn't? Any advice for future Adoption Ambassadors? Would you like to participate again?

Since the program is new, we appreciate any feedback you can give us. If you decide you'd like to do it again, you are encouraged to do so. If you know other people who would like to get involved, let us know and we can get them started!

This program will allow Animal Allies to help many more animals in our community by creating more space in our shelter for incoming animals and giving us the capacity to have more animals available in our adoption program. It helps us reach audiences who may not come to the shelter and who may not be familiar with animal rescue. Becoming an Adoption Ambassador helps spread the word about what we do, and it helps you to engage our community in the importance of animal rescue.


